RSST

The RSST is looking for new members from our community to apply.

The RSST's main objectives are to establish, raise and provide the means and management for Kindergarten and schooling according to the methods advocated by Rudolf Steiner.

The RSST is made up of parents and a representative from the College of Teachers, for the following aspects at Michael Park:

- we are the proprietors and manage the grounds of the Kindergarten and the School;

- 3. the RSST works with the Kindergarten for its educational, licencing and other ongoing requirements, by working closely with Karen Affleck the Kindergarten Manager to ensure that the kindergarten is as best served by the RSST as possible;

BOARD

The RSST operates separately from the Michael Park School Board, however the RSST has a representative that is appointed to the Board.

The Board comprises elected Parent, Staff and Student Representatives as well as the Principal.

Some of the key responsibilities of the Board are:

- Set the strategic direction and long-term plans for the school in consultation with the community.
- Monitor and evaluate student progress and achievement.
- Ensure that educational priorities set by the Ministry for Education are met.

 Fulfil the intent of the Treaty of Waitangi by valuing and reflecting New Zealand's dual cultural heritage.

Appoint and support the principal and assess their performance.

The Board's focus is on the governance of the school and so, other than in exceptional circumstances, does not get involved in operational matters or the day to day running of the school.

The Board typically meets once per month.

Elections for Parent Representatives are held every 3 years and this year is an election year, with the elections being held in September.

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
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
