The Ministry of Education (MOE) has made changes to schools' planning and reporting, as legislated in the Education and Training Act 2020, and this will come into effect on 1 January 2023. Instead of a charter, schools will be required to publish a three-year Strategic Plan, an Annual Implementation Plan, and an Annual Report.

Schools need to work in partnership with their communities to develop their plans so they reflect local needs and priorities. The MOE would like feedback from our whānau and community on this matter. Please help by completing the following survey: <u>Whānau and community survey</u> by 3 June 2022.

### **DIVING INTO TERM 2**

For the first week of term two we, the level 2 P.E students, embarked on a scuba diving course run by Dive HQ. We completed the PADI open water course gaining our open water scuba diver licence. The course ran for a total of four days in which we spent the first two days in a pool learning all the new and challenging skills we needed to keep us calm and safe in the water. These were incredibly long and challenging days, spending hours on end in the pool.

The last two days of the course were spent at lake Pupuke where we got to do our first open water dive. This was exhilarating as we had never been more than a few metres down in a pool. We dove to a whopping 17.5 metres down which made all the hard work in the pool worthwhile. Being that far down was nerve-breaking but truly an experience I will never forget. The realisation really hits you when you're so deep in the water that you can no longer just swim to safety in a few seconds. It's honestly quite terrifying at first but I just reminded myself to remain calm, trust my own skills, and trust my friends.

Overall this was an incredible course that pushed us all out of our comfort zones, allowing us to not only gain new skills and confidence but also score some credits whilst doing so.
