OUTDOOR CLASSROOM HOLIDAY PROGRAMME

The simplicity of making a fire implies gathering materials, splitting wood with an axe and mallet to make kindling and firewood, setting up a trellis and feeding the fire regularly to keep the necessary heat to cook.

The simplicity of seasoning sauce implies chopping ingredients, frying the garlic and seasoning the tomato with salt and oregano.

The simplicity of making pizza bases implies mixing yeast with warm water and sugar, adding the mix to flour and salt, kneading the dough until ready, and leaving to rise for an hour to later bake it in a pan by the open fire.

This process involves tidying up and washing all equipment and living no trace of fires.

Some of our students experienced this beautiful simplicity during the holidays under the outdoor classroom tent, and it proved to be fulfilling and also very hard work. We had two lovely days!

The outdoor classroom programme in our school allows our students to spend purposeful time outdoors in nature, cooking and making crafts, collaborating with each other, navigating their social interactions and problem-solving in the most organic and simplistic way. It is a great holistic approach to developing self-sufficiency and independence. However, like the water in a calm lake, the surface only shows part of its richness, as there is invisible depth to it. Being immersed in these processes for long periods of time helps people to relax and sit into their own inner presence, to engage their will in healing and therapeutic ways. I guess that is why our students like it so much!
