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TE AO MĀORI

Kōrero pukapuka

Central Auckland was bustling with activity in the weekend for the Auckland Writers Festival. As well as being a rich celebration of international writers and books, the festival programme also highlighted te ao Māori by bringing together many of our country's most prominent thinkers, writers, journalists and champions of te reo me ona tikanga Māori in a fantastic series of lectures, discussions and debates. Some of


these may become available to listen to - we'll keep you posted - but in the meantime here are some publications that were highlighted at the festival:

Kia Kaha: a storybook of Māori who changed the world by Stacey Morrison and Jeremy Sherlock is a popular pukapuka for children published last year that tells the life stories of numerous amazing Māori heroes.

Tikanga by Keri Opai, published this year, is an introduction to the customs and practices of te ao Māori by well-respected educator, linguist and cultural advisor, Keri Opai.

Toi Tū Toi Ora by Nigel Borrell is a stunning new book that includes amazing images of works from the ground-breaking exhibition of the same name that was held at the Auckland Art Gallery Toi o Tāmaki in 2020-2021.
