It is with great pride to announce that Michael Park School will have a carved waharoa (entranceway) that will stand in front of our auditorium. It will be the first thing that whanau and visitors will see when coming through our gates.

The school has commissioned master carver Harry Wikaira to carry out the project.

Harry is an experienced master carver who was responsible for the large waharoa at Orakei Marae, Ngati Whatua, mana whenua for our school and more recently completed a waharoa for a school in the North Shore.

Harry started the creation of our waharoa last month and is developing the left and right amo (pillars).

The completion date for our taonga is

scheduled for November this year. We will be providing updates each month to showcase the progress and will elaborate more about the significance of the carvings and its unique significance for our kura.

Once completed, this taonga will reinforce our values of being an inclusive and welcoming place for the whole community. It is the intention that when whānau and visitors see it, they will feel connected to our school's kaupapa of being a Steiner school in Aotearoa and that this will continue for many



generations to come.
