classrooms throughout our school are engaged in some great learning activities (thanks teachers) and are bright-eyed and keen to be back in class after their break.

This Tuesday the high school will be holding their parent/ student/teacher conferences throughout the day. A reminder to high school parents and students that there is no school for Class 8-12 on Tuesday, but they are expected to attend the meetings with their parents.

Last week Virginia Braun, Class 12 graduate of 1990, was inducted into the Royal Society of New Zealand Te Apārangi for her outstanding contribution in the area of psychology. Virginia is a professor of psychology at the University of Auckland and has been described by her students as "the rockstar of gualitative research" – she co-authored one

of the most highly-cited psychological and methodological

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papers ever published, as well as several best-selling books on qualitative research.
