### TAKATŪ TE REO COURSE

#### A REFLECTION FROM BRIAR GIBSON

Ngā mihi o te wā ki a koutou,

Last Sunday, forgoing the traditional brunch and baking with the flatmates, I made my way, bright and early, to
Waipuna Hotel and Conference Centre. I was there to attend the introductory hui to the Takatū Te Reo course for teachers and educators. There, looking over Te Kopua Kai-a-Hiku, we were welcomed in a whakatau.

Throughout the day we got to meet our fellow educators and experience introductory lectures to the subjects we would be covering throughout the six-month course. It was both inspiring and humbling to be in a room with hundreds of educators who are so committed to bringing te reo to their classrooms. Teachers who are committed to improving themselves for the benefit of their students and who are willingly to give up their own time, their weekends, time away from their whanau, to work towards what they feel is owed to their students. Teachers who, idealistically, believe they can find an extra eight hours in a week to work towards these goals.

It reminds me of a quote from Rudolf Steiner, in 'Balance in Teaching' - 'In life it is not the ready knowledge that is of value, but the work which leads to the knowledge'. I have always taken this quote to mean that having lofty ideals is important. Even though one may not be able to deliver on those ideals just yet, doing the mahi towards those ideals is what is of greatest spiritual importance. It was humbling to spend time with tutors who had done the hard mahi to be in a position to share their knowledge with others. It was incredibly encouraging to be in the presence of educators, my Michael Park colleagues included, who have been on and continue to be on this journey to being the educators we want to be and the educators we believe our tamariki deserve. I look forward to continuing this journey with them.

Running over one evening and 3 days, workshops proceed with 3 or 4 people.


