

A prestigious annual event hosted at Auckland Girls Grammar, MUNA is attended by over 90 teams from 44 schools, travelling from as far as Kerikeri and Pukekohe, to debate, inspire and show off their research, diplomacy and knowledge of the UN Charter. The two days are filled with scheduled remit speeches, fiery regional and impromptu debates, innumerable notes sent and new friends made!

Buenas tardes y saludos, hello everyone!

Despite anticipating the event with solicitous suspense, the weekend was a culmination of all our hard work - an absolute blast!

We had been meeting every week to prepare ourselves with an in-depth knowledge of our country in order to know our policies, promises and political parties.

This paid off as Colombia managed to secure itself with a position as representative of all of South America and the Caribbean: the Bloc Leader. As leaders of this impressive region, we were given a regional debate for which we had to discover a resolution: how to stop the food and agriculture crisis within South America.

After discussing this topic with the bloc and representing our solution to the entire assembly, we moved on to the rest of the agenda which included debates on climate change, justice systems and the war in Ukraine. It was an amazing opportunity to see the view from a window into the world of politics, debate, negotiations and diplomacy.

Taking part in MUNA is a collective team effort but every

individual faces personal challenges and receives rewarding outcomes.

Leon says: 'It felt great to be part of such a massive event and to be able to raise my voice and have others hear it. To vote and speak on how we can change and help make this world a better place. It was also an opportunity for me to get comfortable speaking, as well as playing quitar, in front of a great audience.'

Ben comments: 'MUNA was a fantastic time for those who are politically minded or even for those who just like interacting with other schools. I met so many wonderful people there who share many intriguing things in common with each other, and I'm glad to have been a part of that space.'

Luka concludes: 'It was not only formal and serious, but it was also extremely fun and exciting. We dressed up in the native fashion style of Colombia, and I was often compared to Pepa from Disney's 'Encanto', in my yellow dress. It was a peculiar thought with which I realized the next prime minister may very well have been in that room. It was an emancipating experience, and I look forward to exploring further realms of discussion and debate'.




The Michael Park School Ball on the 17th of June is swiftly approaching.


