## FORENSIC MATHS

Last Friday, Class 10 parent Ruben Miller ran an applied Maths session with the students. He showed the class some pictures of synthetic blood stains and asked them to guess what caused them. Students had to look closely at the stains to work out the direction of lines and other patterns. Can you guess what Ruben does for a job? He is a forensic scientist who helps the police to solve serious crime scenes. He showed the class the importance of Maths in his job. He got students to use trigonometry formula they learned in Maths to measure the angle and distance of 'blood' stains on a large sheet of paper.

These will probably waft past young ears without too much disturbance within the playful and high energy context. We leave this up to parents' discretion.
