

Mānawatia a Matariki

As we enter our winter holidays, the Matariki celebrations are starting to happen all around us, which will culminate in the special 'Whāngai i te hautapu' ceremony from Ngongotahā on the morning of 14 July. These celebrations bring connection, meaning and hope during the coldest months of winter and they offer us a chance to deepen our collective understanding of the significance of the Matariki cluster.

This year's theme is Matariki Kāinga Hokia – Returning Home to your Whānau. The Manatū Taonga Matariki resources talk about the layers of significance to this theme. Firstly in the gathering



together of family and sharing kai, memories, hopes and dreams, perhaps with a dawn viewing of the Matariki cluster followed by breakfast, a remembrance tree where we hang harakeke stars for those we've lost in the year gone by, telling whānau stories at a special dinner, sending our wishes to Hiwa -i-te-Rangi, making goals together for the year to come, and being grateful for the moment of being together. But they also speak of the importance of returning to the places we call home, and asking ourselves how we can look after these places more consciously, and how we can care for our rivers, oceans, beaches and land. Is it by digging up noxious weeds that are edging closer to the forest, combing the beach for rubbish, or planting trees together?

For many of us, there will be new traditions developing in our whānau for Matariki, rituals where we find ways to weave the three principles of Matariki Hunga Nui (remembrance), Matariki Ahunga Nui (celebrating the present), and Matariki Manako Nui (looking to the future) into our own celebrations.

These recent months have been hard for many, and this time of coming together, reflecting and looking to the future offer us all a chance to revitalise our wairua and gather sustenance for the months to come. Māṇawatia a Matariki!

A karakia shared by Rangi Matamua to use during this season is:

Mānawa maiea te putanga o Matariki Mānawa maiea te ariki o te rangi Mānawa maiea te Mātahi o te Tau. Whano, whano Haramai te toki ata huakirangi Haumi e Hui e Tāiki e!
