### **MESSAGE FROM THE RSST**

Dear Community,

We are writing to let you know that the RSST has been undertaking a careful analysis and review regarding sustainable financial modelling for our Kindergarten. We have received information from the IRD regarding our donation model which indicates this may not be a viable way forward so we are currently seeking legal advice.

We have formed a committee overseeing this review which includes members from the RSST, Board, and Management and look forward to understanding their recommendations. An extraordinary meeting of the RSST has been convened for Monday 30h November for this purpose. It is then our intention to seek your feedback prior to making any decisions.

The RSST is appreciative of all the care and work from our Kindergarten staff and supportive community. We wish to continue to offer a quality Steiner education for our tamariki going forward.

**Outstanding Play** 


**Best Production**
