Volunteers Needed

Children (3 - 14 years)

Streptococcus A (or Strep A for short) are bacteria and a common cause of sore throats (strep throat) in children. Most Strep A infections are mild, but the bacteria can also cause serious diseases like rheumatic fever.

This study is an important step towards creating a vaccine for Strep A.

What this study involves

- Three home visits throughout the year where samples will be collected (throat swabs, finger-prick blood, and saliva).
- An extra home visit is arranged if your child experiences a sore throat.
- A Koha for participation is available.
