



## Sound Bath Meditation

Come and unwind with a 1 hour Sound Bath meditation with Mary Marok and enjoy a hot cocoa afterwards.

You will be listening to a variety of instruments as you are guided by Mary's voice in to a deep and relaxing meditation. Age 13+ event.

\* Bring a yoga mat, blanket and pillow. Eye mask optional \*

"A Sound Bath is a full-body, immersive listening experience that uses sound to gently but deeply relax the body and nurture the mind. The experience begins with each person seated in a comfortable position or lying down, some people may choose to use a blanket and an eye mask. The practitioner uses the human voice and/or various instruments to guide participants into a meditation by enveloping them in the vibrations of sound and stillness.

Sound baths are excellent for people who find their minds are too active to sit in traditional forms of meditation. They are an excellent tool for managing stress and releasing the anxiety of our busy lives.

Mary Marok has been working with sound her whole life, learning various instruments and singing since childhood. She studied theatre and worked for many years as a voice-over artist. Through her own journey she discovered the power of sound and loves to share the gift of this deeply healing experience with others."
