Tea Towel pricing is: \$15 for 1 \$24 for 2 \$10 each for 3 or more



SPOTLIGHT ON SNAPDRAGON

STAR BABIES AND THE FIVE-YEAR-OLD BIRTHDAY

Birthdays are always a cause for celebration. The focus of this short piece is the 5-year-old's birthday.

Rituals and traditions allow children to experience the "rhythm of the year," it helps to ground them.

Celebrating a child's birthday is not only an opportunity to mark the special day but also honours the child's place in the family and in the world at large. A birthday is a time of hope and a time of looking forward to a new year filled with fresh milestones and experiences. Celebrating another trip around the sun for a child is an opportunity for reflection and a chance to bring beauty, magic, and meaning into their lives.

In Steiner education, the five-pointed star is introduced as a form element in eurythmy, which is a movement art integral to our curriculum. The star is often experienced by children through the shape of their own bodies when they stand with legs apart and arms outstretched, forming an almost regular pentagon.

The pentagram or five-pointed star is associated with the human form, with each point representing the head, arms, and legs, symbolising the human body in harmony with the universe. This symbol is used to help children connect with geometric forms and develop a sense of balance and spatial awareness. The five-pointed star also has broader symbolic meanings, often representing harmony, balance, and the human form.

This is significant for a five-year-old child, as they are developmentally becoming more aware of their bodies in relation to the rest of their world. Their thinking is beginning to wake up, and they have increasing control of their limbs. Their play is of the fairy tale world, and imaginative play is now more adept.

At bedtime on the evening before your child's 5th birthday, light a candle and share this special verse:

When I have said my evening prayer,
And my clothes are folded on the chair,
And mother switches off the light,

Before the darkness turns to gold,
Tomorrow, I'll be five years old.
Five kisses when I wake,
Five candles on my cake.




