NZ ENGINEERING SCIENCE COMPETITION

Last Saturday, 281 teams from across New Zealand, including Michael Park School, tackled the challenging problem: "How many airships would be required to replace the Cook Strait Ferries?" The question, released at 10 am, didn't initially seem like a typical math or science problem, but with careful thought, teams applied both mathematical modelling and science-based principles to find solutions. Representing Michael Park School, Lucas, Luka, Jasper and Isabelle from Class 12 spent 8 hours working on their submission.

Rather than just writing research reports, teams were encouraged to incorporate as much mathematical modelling as possible. The open-ended nature of the problem required participants to interpret it and make reasonable assumptions a crucial part of the challenge. Given the incomplete data provided, teams were allowed to use sensible estimates, when necessary, as long as they justified their choices. We are very proud of our students for carrying on Michael Park School's participation for the third year. Well done! Murphy has been selected as a finalist in the 'NZ Top Dog Awards' in the category 'top dog with a job' (the most golden classroom assistant)! Out of over 350 entries he's made the top 20. He's also up for the People's Choice award, so, if you can spare two minutes to vote for Murphy, Class Five would be so grateful. https://tinyurl.com/votemurphy



PĀNUI FROM THE WHARE PUKAPUKA



TE AO MĀORI

A space dedicated to promoting te reo me ona tikanga Māori

Kia ora e te whānau whānui

It's been another great week in the whare pukapuka, with lots of people turning up to support our te reo Māori club, and akonga (students) enjoying getting to know more reo phrases in their library lessons.

Weekly Reo Māori Challenge

Some staff are participating in a Weekly Reo Challenge which will run all term. This week's challenge was to find a way to acknowledge and celebrate the beautiful whakataukī that are on the plaque outside each classroom. If you are in visiting school, see if you can spot the whakataukī that have been especially chosen for each class, that are presented on a wooden plaque alongside a beautiful image of a related manu (bird) for each class. Here is some of the history of this project:

When Whaea Andrea Gordine first came to teach full-time at MPS, she asked students and staff what they wanted regarding Te Ao Māori in the school. Some students wanted birds or animals for classes instead of calling them Class 1-12. When Andrea proposed this idea to the College of Teachers, she found out that this mahi was already underway. Former staff members John Lawry and Whaea Jade Flavell had worked together to match manu with the impulses and characteristics of each class. Whaea Beverly Findlay then kindly offered to do the artwork for us.

The class whakatauki and Class manu were unveiled and blessed in 2021 as part of our Matariki & Winter solstice festival celebrations. There are two wooden plaques for each class, one with the artwork on it and the other with a whakatauki/proverb.



You are welcome to join our Te Reo Māori Club Wenerei lunchtimes, 12.40-1.10pm in the whare pukapuka.

Open to all students, staff and whānau—learn te reo in a fun, light-hearted environment. And don't forget about kapa haka on Fridays in the music room! (You'll need to sign in at the office to attend both of these events.)


Tongariro is renowned for its beauty and diverse outdoor activities including walks, waterfalls, hot pools and swimming holes.
