## Craft for all ages at MPS

Many of us chose Steiner Education for our children consciously. It is a lovely choice, because it involves not only the education of the mind, but the heart and eye for beauty in nature and the coordination between your eyes and hands to create.

Rudolf Steiner saw the development of children the same way as the development of human kind. Hence there are main lessons about ancient cultures, lessons to balance the brain and



lessons creating things with your hands. Steiner incorporated crafts into his philosophy and school curriculum. This was to balance all the thinking with the education of finger dexterity through doing, making, creating - because nothing one-sided can blossom into its full potential.



Over the school years, children learn and build upon their finger dexterity and control from simple finger knitting to knitting with needles, hand sewing and crochet and using sewing machines. Just like humanity developed from doing simple crafts to amazingly complicated, highly skilled and beautiful artworks, so do your children's creations.

To create well rounded human beings, we need to use all our senses, seeing, hearing and feeling with our hands too. The ancient crafts are so very important to help develop the other side of our brain/body connection, in a similar way that learning another language develops the brain. It doesn't matter if you're not fluent in a second or third language, it's about training different parts of the brain to tap into potential.

At our school, we have the unique opportunity to join our parent-run craft group, as well as parent-run ceramics and woodwork groups. At our craft group we love to support families by helping learn new skills, like the ability to make toys

for your children with the Steiner educational approach in mind. Or, if you need help in supporting your children to master their handwork lessons.



we are able to give you guidance in the creative. arts and crafts, to explore finger dexterity and visual impact of colours and materials, and an understanding of why we do things



differently at a Steiner School.

If you would like to explore another side of your brain, craft group meets every Friday in the handwork room (underneath class four) from 9-11.30am. We would like to invite you, our community and friends, to some happy crafting, sharing and

extending skills and knowledge.

You can be a regular or just drop in when you have time. We have kits available for you to take away and practice at home if you prefer. If you are stuck on a project of your own, come and get a bit of help from one of our skilled crafters. We also hold specific workshops throughout the year, so, if there is anything you are interested in learning,



just let us know and we can make it happen.
