PART-TIME EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT WORKER IN KINDERGARTEN

Michael Park Kindergarten is looking for a warm individual with excellent organisational and problem-solving skills as an educational support worker to provide health and learning support for five-year-old tamariki with extra needs.

This is a part time position 4 days a week from 9.30am -**12.00pm**. The support required will be feeding (tube) as well as educational (speech and language and social) support. As such, a high level of oral communication and initiative is required as well as the ability to work well as part of a team.

There will be regular meetings with kaiako, whānau and CCS disability action to monitor and review progress and educational plans.

Working in the kindergarten the educational support worker will be willing to undertake professional learning and development relating to their tasks and responsibilities, including those associated with the Special Character/ philosophy as required.

Ideally this person will be prepared to continue supporting this tamariki while she is in the kindergarten for the next 2 and half years. The position will start from the beginning of term 3 on Monday 14th July 2025.

Huge mihi to Alice Newman who looked after the library so beautifully in my absence. I am very grateful for your fabulous work, Alice!


Librarian-led library and te reo lessons have resumed this week.

FAQs

- How long are these hosting experiences? Generally from four nights up to 14
 nights. You will be hosting one or two (or maybe three) students depending on
 your space availability.
- Can my homestays share the bedroom? If you get two Students at the same time, they can share the bedroom but must have two separate beds.
- I have one Queen or King-sized bed in my spare room, can my homestays share the bed? No! The beds can be in form of two single beds, or a bunk bed or a trundler bed
- What do my homestay students do during the day? Students will attend
 Michael Park School during the day and will spend the afternoon with their host
- What does the fee that I'm paid include? The fee paid to you includes three
 meals a day with snacks, transport and some local sightseeing in your free time.
- Do the whole family have to be involved in this hosting experience? A full
 family inclusion is required. Basically looking after these students like your own
 children.
- What are the arrival and departure times and days of your next group? You will
 meet your homestay students for the first time on Sunday 15th June at around
 6:00pm and you will say goodbye to them on Saturday 21st June at around
 9:00am.
- How much will I be paid? You will be paid \$960 for hosting two students at the same time. Full fee will be paid to you on Friday 20th June.
