## TE AO MĀORI

A space dedicated to promoting te reo me ōna tikanga Māori

#### **KETE ARONUI**

A glimpse of the work happening in our te reo Māori classes.

We have now been having te reo Māori lessons for Classes 1 to 5 for half of our school year. It has been a real pleasure to pick up this kaupapa this year and to see the akonga so enthusiastic about this opportunity for language learning.

Through kēmu (games), waiata and mahi pukapuka (book work), we have been learning how to introduce ourselves and say how we are feeling. We're learning numbers, the names of some colours, days of the week, months of the year, directions, actions, the weather, and we've shared lots of puka whakaahua (picture books).

He tino pai ngā mahi o ngā tamariki!



Kete aronui: means basket of knowledge of aroha, peace and the arts and crafts which benefit the Earth and all living things - one of the three baskets of knowledge. This basket relates to knowledge acquired through careful observation of the environment. It is also the basket of ritual, of literature, philosophy and is sometimes regarded as the basket of the humanities (text from Te Aka dictionary).





### LIBRARY NEWS

#### Celebrating classic novels

During our library sessions this week, we've been talking about how the July holidays are a great time for reading.

In the library, Class 4 and Class 5 are currently working on a Classics novels challenge and they are making their way through lots of the classics we have in the library. Reading a classic by audiobook, or having parents read it aloud counts too, and it is great to see so many children pick up the challenge in some shape or form.

It's a great reminder that classic novels are an excellent way to support our children's reading; both for those children whose reading is still developing and for those children who seem to devour books. Having these books read aloud by a family member who also loves the book adds a whole new dimension to the experience of a classic, and this does not need to stop when children can read to themselves — in fact, reading the classics (or any book rich in themes and figurative language) aloud can be one of the most significant supports we give to our children (and tweens) both for their literacy and socioemotional development.

Classics often require extra work; to unravel the themes of the story, to understand the vocabulary (often more complex than modern literature), and to 'time travel' back in history, piecing together a world often familiar yet so different from our own. In this way, a good classic novel offers the opportunity for children to really "deepen" their reading, helping develop understanding of the human condition and extending language and grammar all at once.

It can be hard to find the next good book to read out loud. Don't forget we have lists available at the library (email Kura in term time at <a href="mailto:kurar@michaelpark.school.nz">kurar@michaelpark.school.nz</a> if you would like one sent to you), but here are a number of excellent online resources that you might want to explore too:





# Outdoor Classroom Holiday Workshop with Luis Bernal
