

A very warm welcome back to the new term. I trust you had a restful and enjoyable break. As we begin another exciting chapter together, it's heartening to see our vibrant school




It has been wonderful to witness the joy our new rope pyramid has brought to the tamariki this week—what a fantastic addition to our playground!

TE AO MĀORI

A space dedicated to promoting te reo me ōna tikanga Māori

Kia ora e te whānau whānui

This term we are again picking up the Matariki Te Reo Challenge for staff that we started last year. This is a voluntary challenge to support the growth of te reo Māori in our kura.

As our overall focus this year has been on Turangawaewae, many of the challenges will centre around our local taiao (environment). The first week has been looking at the reo Māori names of our local maunga.

The meanings of the names for these maunga is shared on the Tupuna Maunga Authority website (along with lots of other amazing history of the maunga):

Maungarei (Mt Wellington) means 'watchful mountain'



Maungauika (North Head) means the mountain of Uika, relating to ancestors who occupied it around 800 years ago.



Maungakiekie (One Tree Hill) means the 'hill of the kiekie vine'

PAT HANLY CREATIVITY PROJECT AND AWARDS 2025

At the start of term two our level 3 Visual Arts students attended the kick off sessions for this year's Pat Hanly Creativity Pro-

ject at the Auckland Art Gallery Toi o Tāmaki. The day involved viewing Mark Adams retrospective photography, the Taimoana exhibition and partaking in a printmaking workshop with artist Ani O'Neill. An additional bonus was to work and catch up with Naomi Azoulay, a past parent and craft-week collage artist who was supporting the education team at Toi o Tāmaki. The students returned to school to start making art in their respective disciplines from the inspiration they gained and in

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following works. "We all enjoyed speaking with your students so much. They are so well spoken and we were truly impressed with them as individuals as well as their artwork!" They will select at least one artwork to be exhibited in the Pat Hanly Creativity Exhibition and Awards at Auckland Art Gallery Toi o

Tāmaki from 15th to 31st August. An announcement of artwork selected for exhibition will be made on the 4th August.

Our students talked about their art, answered questions and received feedback. The representatives reported back with the








Main Lessons

CLASS 8 GEOMETRY

In the Steiner-inspired approach, the main lesson on Geometry for Class 8 in 2025 integrates the intellectual, artistic, and practical aspects of learning to foster holistic development. Students engage deeply with the geometric concepts by exploring the relationship between two- and three-dimensional shapes through hands-on construction of Platonic solids using nets, cultivating their practical skills and spatial understanding.



The process begins with thoughtful planning, encouraging reflective thinking, followed by active building, which awakens their physical engagement and creative expression. The emotional and aesthetic appreciation of the shapes nurtures their sense of beauty and harmony, culminating in a meaningful connection to the shapes'

forms. Incorporating Māori patterns on the title page adds a cultural dimension, fostering reverence for natural and artistic patterns, and enriching the lesson with cultural consciousness. This approach emphasizes experiential learning and intuitive understanding, nurturing the student's head, heart, and hands in harmony.





