#### **SCHOOL BOARD ELECTIONS**

Schooled Election Pilot has been appointed by the Michael Park School Board as the returning officer for the upcoming triennial school board election.

#### **Staggered Election Cycle**

We are seeking 6 parent representatives for the Michael Park School Board (not 7, as stated in the email from Election Pilot) and we encourage you to nominate yourself or someone else for these roles.

The MPS Board has agreed to adopt a staggered election cycle. This won't affect this election, where 6 parent representative positions are to be filled but, going forward, a mid-term election will be held as well as the usual triennial election, and 3 parent representative positions would be filled at each of those elections.

The board felt the staggered election cycle approach would provide better continuity for the Board and the school.

To get in sync with the staggered election cycle, 3 of the 6 positions being filled at this coming election will be for a half (18 month) term. Which parent representatives do the shorter term will be by mutual agreement or based on lowest number of votes if mutual agreement cannot be reached.

## TE AO MĀORI

A space dedicated to promoting te reo me ona tikanga Māori

This week in our Matariki Te Reo Challenge, I shared a folder of resources with staff that trace some of the history of the waka that landed in Tāmaki Makaurau, or, as it is sometimes called, 'Tāmaki Herenga Waka' - the gathering place of waka.

I also shared an article with some amazing korero about the names of places in our region and the article includes the pūrākau about Hape, who, so the pūrākau goes, caught a ride to Aotearoa on a stingray after he was left behind in Hawaiki when the Tainui waka set out to Aotearoa, arriving into Manukau Harbour before the Tainui waka. It's well worth a read to find out more about the significance of this pūrākau to many of the names of places (such as Karangahape Road) in our rohe. 

## PREDICTABILITY THROUGH RHYTHM: CREATING CALM IN THE EVERYDAY

In a child's life, predictability equals security

In a busy and ever-changing world, rhythm offers children something deeply nourishing: a sense of security. When they know what to expect, they can relax, feel safe, and meet the day with more confidence.

Rhythm is more than routine. It's the gentle repetition of moments that are held with warmth and presence - like lighting a candle at breakfast, singing a tidy-up song, or walking the same path to school each morning.

These small, familiar rituals carry connection and meaning. They anchor children in the flow of the day and help ease transitions, especially when there's resistance or big feelings.

When something isn't working - mornings feel rushed, bedtimes are a battle - it can help to step back and bring in a sense of rhythm. Is there one small, meaningful gesture you could repeat each day to bring a bit more joy or connection to that moment?

Rhythms don't need to be elaborate. In fact, the simpler, the better. They grow slowly, with intention and care. Preparing the night before can help you meet the morning with calm, and prevent the friction that often comes when things feel unpredictable.


What we'll cover:

## Michael Park School Apparel




