












# Whole School Art Exhibition

# RSST mid-year community update

Dear Michael Park community,

We would like to let you know about some of the things that we are working on in 2025.

#### Special character

The RSST supports teacher roles in the school that enhance Steiner education, such as the handwork programme. The trust also delivers a programme of parent education each year, which has included the 9 year old talk, handwork and outdoor classroom education in 2025 so far, with more events to come - stay tuned! In 2025 we are embarking on a project to document Steiner Education at Michael Park school on behalf of the community, that we will be able to share with you as this develops. We are working with the College of Teachers to support high school kaiako in deepening their skills and knowledge in Steiner education. As trustees we also engage in ongoing learning to continually develop our understanding of Steiner education.

#### Kindergarten

We have just completed our internal strategic review for the Kindergarten. The Kindergarten focus for the next 12 months will be on strengthening community connection, supporting kaiako development, continued growth and bringing in new initiatives such as a playgroup and anthroposophical nursing on site.

#### Marketing

You may have noticed an increase in our social media presence. Through Dana's excellent work we are starting to see growing reach and stronger engagement. This work is ongoing. This is part of a comprehensive marketing plan for the school and kindergarten across Google, Meta, billboards and community signage which was fully activated in June.

#### **Finance**

Throughout the year we review and approve the financial performance and reporting of the trust across our Kindergarten, property, special character and other portfolios. This includes improving financial process and policy as needed.

#### Other work

Our trustees are working on several ongoing projects such as the review of 10 year property planning in collaboration with the Board and supporting the development of an alumni database alongside the Helping Hands group. We would like to take the opportunity to acknowledge the Helping Hands of Michael Park for their work supporting the RSST kaupapa.

We are a busy group with plenty of passion for our roles and we are always looking for new members or support on a more informal basis. We would love to hear from you if you would be keen to get involved in any way.
