#### **CELEBRATING OUR EQUESTRIAN TEAM**

We are so proud of our talented riders Georgia (Class 9), Robert (Class 9) and Coco (Class 10) who recently represented our school at the **North Island Secondary School Equestrian event**.

The competition was tough, with most dressage fields having 30 competitors and over 60 riders in the show jumping. Despite this, our small but mighty trio shone with some outstanding results:

- Robert 2nd and 3rd in Dressage
- Coco 7th and 17th in Dressage, 3rd in Show Jumping, and an incredible 1st place across all three Show Hunter classes
- Georgia 7th and 8th in Dressage

In the overall Dressage team results, we placed **14th out of 77 teams** - a fantastic achievement considering we only had half a full team of riders competing.

Beyond the ribbons and placings, what stood out most was the spirit of the team. Georgia, Robert, and Coco supported one another every step of the way.

A huge congratulations to our equestrian team - you represented our school with skill, style, and teamwork. We are very proud of you.


