HE KUPU WHAKAMANA A MESSAGE FROM THE MPS BOARD AND THE RUDOLF STEINER SCHOOLS TRUST

Tēnā koutou e te whānau,

Many in the education sector have been surprised by the Government's recent amendments to the Education and Training Act, particularly the change from requiring boards to "give effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi" to a focus on "reasonable steps" and cultural diversity. These changes arrived quickly and have generated a range of responses across the motu.

We want to reassure our community that this legislative wording does not change who we are or the commitments we hold. Te Tiriti has long been central to our kaupapa and will remain so. Our direction is grounded, established over many years, and is not altered by changes in phrasing within the Act.

For us, Te Tiriti is a living commitment:

- to partnership
- to cultural identity
- to shared responsibility
- to ensuring every child feels seen, valued and at home in Aotearoa

Keeping Te Tiriti at the heart of our school supports the wellbeing of our tamariki, kaiako and whānau, strengthens relationships, and fosters a sense of belonging for every child.

Our Steiner philosophy aligns with these commitments. Respect for the individuality of the child, meaningful relationships, and learning through head, heart and hands sit naturally alongside Te Tiriti and enrich our school's kaupapa by uplifting:

- the dignity and mana of the child
- cultural identity
- connection with the land
- · strong community relationships
- learning rooted in understanding and responsibility

Our staff continue to deepen their learning of te ao Māori, supported by many who walk alongside us, and this remains a valued and ongoing journey.

Thank you, whānau, for your trust and partnership.

We look forward to continuing this path together with Te Tiriti as a guiding principle in all we do.



(And a huge thank you to Fleur for making our wagons so beautifully festive).








CLASS 4 FAMILY TREE PROJECTS




