Goodbye note from Luis Bernal

Dear friends,

I find myself deeply moved as I seat under the outdoor classroom tent observing Finlay Newton, Class 12 student who graduated on Wednesday, leading students into the experience of hand spinning sheep wool, after carding it by hand to turn it into yarn, and eventually into a knitted or crochet garment. The simplicity of the process allows a deep connection with the material and the source from where it all comes from, and with it, a deep connection with nature and oneself. It becomes a true experience of being human. Finlay is one of the nine passionate crafts practitioners holding workshops, four of them parents of our school. The event is available to 95 students in classes 7 to 10. We call this event Craft Week and it happens every year on the very last week of school. This year our

students had the tough decision of picking from one out of the following workshops: Knife making, fine metal jewellery, stage makeup and SFX art, cooking, ceramics, book binding, stained glass, resin casting and wool spinning. So attractive it is that 21 of our class 10 students, for whom the event is optional, have decided to stay at school for an extra week to join us.

Making crafts around a fire collaboratively is a social event that is linked to the deepest roots of any culture, and is a vehicle to creating healthy societies that collaborate in the search of everyone's benefit. Our school cherishes this event profoundly and allocates big resources for it to happen. It is one of many activities that allows us to deliver the special character that we stand for.

I feel specially moved this year knowing that this is the last craft week I will hold at MPS. As you know I have decided to move to Melbourne next year to help another Steiner school set up their outdoor classroom program. I find myself in a bittersweet moment of transition, knowing that I must leave behind this lovely school, this community, my dear colleagues and my beloved students. Specialist teachers like me have the benefit of teaching all ages, and we get to see our students grow and develop and are lucky to build deep and strong bounds with them. I am leaving behind a big family and lots of friends, and walking towards a new adventure.

I also leave behind a beautiful warm-hearted woman in Kirsten Anderson, to take over the outdoor classroom. The school has made a fantastic appointment. We have been interacting this term and I can assure you that our beloved program couldn't be in better hands.

All that is left is to thank you all from the bottom of my heart, for being part of my life and giving me and my family a community we can call home. We leave with a deep sense of loss and we grieve it with tears of gratitude. We look ahead with excitement and joy, and hope that we will stay connected to this school and all that it stands for.

Today, Friday 5th of December, is my last working day at the school. I will be around on Monday morning to say goodbye to the children, I will be around the school until 1pm. I fly to Mexico on Tuesday 6th December to spend a few weeks with my parents in Mexico before the next adventure begins.

I hope you don't mind I take a piece of your heart with me, and certainly leave a piece of my heart in your hands.


CLASS 4 LOCAL HISTORY




